Porto	Lisbon
<p>Portuguese Oporto, city and port, northern Portugal.</p> <p>The city lies along the Douro River, 3 km from the river's mouth on the Atlantic Ocean and 280 km north of Lisbon.</p> <p>Porto features a warm-summer Mediterranean climate.</p> <p>It has a population of just 231,800 people in a municipality with only 41,4 km².</p> <p>World-famous for its port wine, Porto is Portugal's second largest city and is the commercial and industrial centre for the zone north of the Mondego River: it is recognised as a global city.</p> <p>Oporto is one of the oldest European centres, and its core was proclaimed a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1996, as "Historic Centre of Porto, Luiz I Bridge and Monastery of Serra do Pilar".</p>	<p>Portuguese Lisboa, city, port, capital of Portugal, and the centre of the Lisbon metropolitan area.</p> <p>It has a population of around 2.7 million people and is one of the oldest cities in the world.</p> <p>The city occupies an area of 100 km².</p> <p>Located in western Portugal on the estuary of the Tagus (Tejo) River, it is the westernmost capital city in continental Europe.</p> <p>Lisbon has a mild Mediterranean climate with short, mild and rainy winters and warm to hot, dry summers.</p> <p>Lisbon is the country's chief port, largest city, and commercial, political, and tourist centre.</p> <p>It is one of two Portuguese cities (alongside Porto) to be recognised as a global city: it is one of the major economic centres in Europe.</p>
